Mysteries of the Rosary

What are the Mysteries of the Rosary? The Rosary is a prayer that involves meditating on specific events in the life of Jesus and Mary, known as mysteries. These events are grouped into four sets:

Joyful Mysteries:

(Mondays and Saturdays) These focus on the early life of Jesus, including the Annunciation, Visitation, Nativity, Presentation, and Finding in the Temple.

• Sorrowful Mysteries:

(Tuesdays and Fridays) These focus on the Passion and Death of Jesus, including the Agony in the Garden, Scourging at the Pillar, Crowning with Thorns, Carrying of the Cross, and Crucifixion.

• Glorious Mysteries:

(Wednesdays and Sundays) These focus on the Resurrection and Ascension of Jesus, as well as the Descent of the Holy Spirit, the Assumption of Mary, and her Coronation.

• Luminous Mysteries:

(Thursdays) These focus on the public life of Jesus, including the Baptism of Jesus, the Wedding at Cana, the Proclamation of the Kingdom, the Transfiguration, and the Institution of the Eucharist.

Stations of the Cross

- 1. Jesus is condemned to death.
- 2. Jesus accepts the cross.
- 3. Jesus falls the first time.
- 4. Jesus meets his mother.
- 5. Simon of Cyrene helps Jesus.
- 6. Veronica wipes Jesus' face.
- 7. Jesus falls a second time.
- 8. Jesus meets the women of Jerusalem
- 9. Jesus falls a third time.
- 10. Jesus is stripped of his clothes
- 11. Jesus is crucified.
- 12. Jesus dies on the cross.
- 13. Jesus' body is taken down from the cross.
- 14. Jesus is laid in the tomb.
